# City Pulse: October Council Highlights

On October 3, St. George City Council unanimously voted to condemn portions of 18 parcels of land essential for advancing the Kansas Department of Transportation's Safe Routes to School program.

This program enables cities to develop sidewalks and other infrastructure that support safe walking routes for students commuting to neighborhood schools. The council's resolution was passed with a 4-0 vote, marking a key step toward improving student safety in the area.

Council member Judd McCormack provided an update on the Request for Proposals (RFP) he is preparing for the hall property. During the project's development, he received feedback suggesting several modifications to the original RFP, attracting aimed more responses.

The council had no objections to these changes.
